Product Review

The Carson MM-380 is a pocket size microscope that works with your smartphone's camera or naked eye. What impressed me was the ability to achieve a good magnification for viewing coins and their varieties. The 20x magnification and built in LED light made the image on the phone easy to see. Focus is achieved by simply tapping the phone screen. There is a manual focus on the microscope body for naked eye viewing but for me using with the phone was easier. Glare from the light reflecting off the coins was minimal. Simply mount the adapter clip onto your smartphone camera and the microscope magnetically attaches. You will now be able to take photos and videos through your smartphone of anything you view under the microscope. Small enough for putting in your pocket when attending meetings or shows.

The microscope features 3 different lights:

LED microscope light LED flashlight

UV light





Will fit most smartphones, including the iPhone XS Max/X and latest Samsung phones. Available on Amazon or Ebay for about \$16.
