Judy's submission is based on a 1962 Orillia souvenir pendant flag with the perfect image of a Mountie centre in the Orillia terrain! Sir Sam Steele's letters are in the Orillia Museum. Sir Samuel Benfield Steele and his family feature prominently in the history of Medonte (now Oro-Medonte) and Orillia. In fact, OMAH is housed in the Sir Samuel Steele Memorial Building named in his honour.

Judy also submitted a designed based on the SS Edmund Fitzgerald by Gordon Lightfoot.

The main subject, the Orillia Opera House, was chosen as it is said to be one of Orillia's most famous landmarks.

- The white lines and spaces between them represent the facets of a cut diamond which in turn represents the club's diamond (60th) anniversary.
- The building is the clearest in the centre of the image and blends into the facets with each successive ring. The outermost ring of facets has just a plain field.
- The two maple leaves at the left and right sides signify our Canadian heritage, identity and national pride.
- Black elements such as the text and leaves are at 100% relief.
- White elements such as the facet lines and outlines around the text are at 0% relief which is traditionally the level of the field.



This results in the central part of the building being in high relief relative to the surrounding field while there is less contrast as you get closer to the edge.

The deadline is Saturday December 18th when the last submissions will be accepted.


Bill Beattie will be the contact person at either of his email addresses as before bill.beattie@sympatico.ca or bssbtt199@gmail.com.

The price per coin is the same as before, \$7.00 per coin plus tax 13%--which applies to Canadian, USA and Great Britain Circulation Coins. Note Foreign Coins, Gold Coins and Tokens are \$15 per coin plus tax. Forms are available on the ICCS website <a href="https://www.iccscoin.ca">www.iccscoin.ca</a> you do not have to register to print out the PDF form.

We are setting the deadline date as December 18, 2021 so when you are ready to submit your coins with your completed form, cheque or cash for the total amount. Please advise Bill Beattie so we can arrange for your delivery to a local club member as before. We will confirm the drop off points in the next few weeks. The uncertified coins will be delivered to ICCS in the later part of January and the certified coins will likely be available to pick up in early April 2022.

# THE DOMINION OF CANADA MEDAL (DYK No. 080)

**Did You Know**... the Dominion of Canada medal was first awarded to Canadian exhibitors at the Philadelphia Centennial Exhibition held in 1876?

The Philadelphia Centennial Exhibition, held May 10 – November 10, 1876, was the largest exhibition held in North America up to that time. More than 30,000 displays represented the fifty American States and 46 countries. Canada was afforded 25,133 square feet of space in the Main building, the largest building covering more than 21 acres at 464 feet in width and 1,880 feet in length. There were many different products displayed by larger Canadian manufacturers as well as many small independent producers.

The Canadian Commission, with the intention of affording inducements to Canadian exhibitors at the Centennial Exhibition, offered gold, silver and bronze medals as prizes with the promise that the awards of such medals would be made by foreign judges. The Commission appealed to the British Commissioners to aid with this task. The request was well-received and the assistance of 18 British Judges ".....accepted with pleasure the proposal made to them to award special medals to the Canadian exhibitors". Canadian exhibitors were awarded 403 Centennial Exhibition medals by the US government and a total of 341 (12 gold, 134 silver and 195 bronze) medals by the Canadian Commission.

After the Philadelphia Centennial Exhibition of 1876, the medals were used as awards at the Provincial Exhibitions across Ontario for a number of years.

According to Canadian numismatist R.W. McLachlan the initial order of 200 medals were struck and delivered to Montréal within two weeks at a cost of one franc (nineteen cents) each.






Canadian Exhibition prize medal, 1876 - Obverse: DOMINION OF CANADA. A winged figure of Fame flying to right, holding palm branch and blowing a trumpet. Signed P. TASSET. Reverse: Crowned shield of arms of the Dominion of Canada within a maple wreath, open at the top and with a beaver at the part below shield.

#### THE DOMINION OF CANADA MEDAL continued.

This silver medal was awarded to Green Bros. of Innerkip, Ontario, for their prize Hereford Bull at the Provincial Exhibition held in London, Ontario in 1885.





The Dominion of Canada medals were engraved by (Ernest) Paulin Tasset (1839 - 1921) a well-known sculptor and medalist who, over several years, produced many medals for the Paris Mint in France. The Dominion of Canada medal has the distinction of being a Canadian medal, struck in France and first awarded in the United States.


