ICCS Coin Certification Update

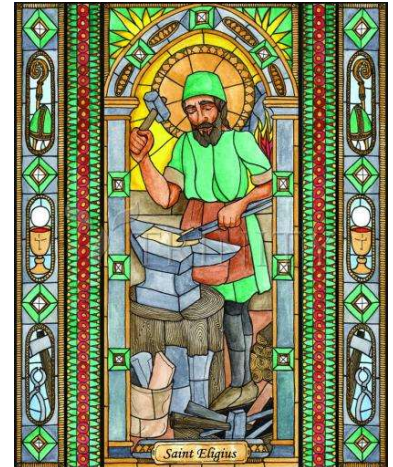
ICCS coin lots were delivered to ICCS on January 5th and the certified coins will likely be available to pick up in early April 2022.

Did You Know?

Speaking of numismatists, did you know there is a Patron Saint for Numismatists?

Saint Eligius was born around 588 and lived in France. He was a metal worker by occupation and died around 659. He is also the Patron Saint of goldsmiths and other metalworkers.

In this day and age, modern numismatics is the study of the coins from the mid 17th century onwards. This is because the period of machine struck coins began here. A collector is more likely to be interested in modern numismatics than a historian, because history from that time onwards is far better documented than ancient times.
