Bill will have a few forms at the next Club meetings.



**The deadline is October 31, 2022 so when you are ready to submit your coins return the completed form, and a cheque or cash for the total amount--all payable to ICCS. Please advise Bill Beattie so we can arrange for your delivery at a Club meeting or to a local club member as before. We will confirm the drop off points in the next few weeks. The uncertified coins will be delivered to ICCS in early November and the certified coins will likely be available for pick up in Late January 2023.**

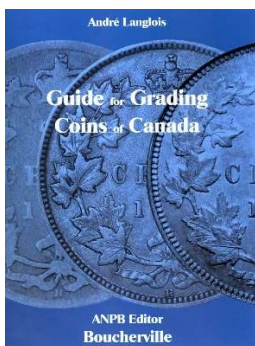

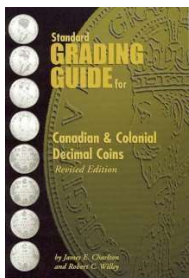

One of the highlights was the convention medal honouring Bill English. The 60th convention medal design was chosen from designs submitted to the convention committee. This year “We are honouring one of the founders of the Ontario Numismatic Association, Mr. William English. Sixty years ago, Bill co-founded the ONA and has been an amazing ambassador of numismatics”. Bill was on hand to greet members, friends, and newcomers.



I attended the ONA convention as a delegate for the Champlain club. It was a very interesting convention as it was held in conjunction with Trajan Publishing's National Postage Stamp & Coin Show. As your delegate I was able to meet other club delegates and the executive of the ONA. We shared how our clubs were operating and how we were once again meeting in person. Sean Sinclair (President) and Scott Douglas (Past President) greeted us Saturday morning at the delegate's breakfast. I also met Stephen Adams, the ONA Club Services Chairman and he did an interesting presentation on collecting the Bank of Canada banknotes. Our club engages with Cassidy for newsletter and youth material for our April Scouts event to name a few.
