News of the October 2022 Meeting

President Murray Smith welcomed us back by wondering where everyone was and wishing us a Happy Thanksgiving. Murray and Secretary/Treasurer Doug McGarvey asked how many members had read the minutes published in the newsletter. They wish to save time in future meetings by skipping the reading and just having them adopted as printed. Since the newsletter had just been published last minute, Doug read the minutes which were adopted as read by Jeff Wilson and Mike Cole. October birthdays included Rob Durrant and Cindy Sherman.

Murray reiterated the protocol for inclement weather and urged members to check their email on the day of the meeting for cancelations.

Murray asked the members if the club wanted to retain their 2017 medallions including 1 silver and 4 copper. After some discussion a motion was carried that the club would keep a silver and copper and auction the rest to raise funds. The first one will be auctioned in November.

Murray announced that we are now allowed to have refreshments at our meeting. Since no one volunteered to make tea or coffee it was suggested by Murray we could just bring in our own.

The Christmas venue was re-examined due to the restrictions being lifted at the church but it decided to remain with Big Cedar Estates as there would be more room. The price limit for the gift exchange was raised to \$10 and be labelled for anyone instead of by gender.

Chris displayed his latest idea to raise funds for the club with coffee mugs made up by his wife with our club logo. The mugs would be a very reasonable \$7 with 40% going to the club's library fund.

Rob Durrant updated us on our upcoming coin show in Gravenhurst. Rob had sold 13 tables and had ordered a number of signs online which were shown to the members. There will be a young collectors table and Chris will collect entry fees. Rob has placed announcements in the local papers as well as various coin publications.

In recognition of all the work and support Rob Durrant and his family have done for the club, Murray and Doug presented Rob with lead splash and a brass medallion of our 60th anniversary medallion.

For our show and tell time, Murray displayed a \$4 bill that his grandmother had carried in her purse for many years. Rob Durrant passed around his set of 1965 silver dollars varieties and his 1937 proof set in a clam shell case.

Our guest and now new member Jim Heifetz drew Bill Robertson as the winner of the 50/50 draw for \$7.50.

Jeff Wilson gave us his Power Point presentation on the 2-dollar coin complete with its history, production, commemorative and varieties.


In Review - Orillia Champlain 2022 Fall Coin Show



Canadian paper money has a long and storied history. Paper money was first used in the nation when 17th Century New France colonists used playing cards in place of Spanish and French coins. Supply of Old World coins was becoming hard to get and a local governor eventually signed off on making these playing card legal currency in New France.

Today's paper/Polymer money tells the story of Canada's history and showcases Canadian scenes.
