RCNA Convention in Halifax

This July, I was able to attend the bourse at the RCNA Convention in Halifax as I was visiting family during the week the RCNA Convention. If you haven't been to a bourse at the RCNA Convention, you really

should. There were dealers from all parts of Canada including many from Ontario. I saw a few familiar faces including Jeff Wilson who was the Bourse Chairman and Cassidy Stroud in charge of the Young Collectors Programme table.





I was on a mission to find an example of a Charles I coin to complete my run of British Monarchs from Queen Mary I to Charles III and was happy to find one from a dealer from from, he

mentioned that the coin I bought was part of a collection he had bought from one of our members, Bill English.

I also picked up a convention medallion and have since regretted not buying a few more.

I bailed out after spending a few hours and many dollars and drove back to my son's place in the north west end of the city. When I was turning into his place, I got caught in the biggest torrential downpour I had ever experienced and I have experienced a tropical storm in Cuba. A New Royal Era - Did You Know?

King Charles III will replace his predecessor, the late Queen Elizabeth II, on Canada's coins and \$20 bill after officially being crowned Canada's sovereign.

First the Mint will have to invite artists to express interest and submit proposed designs. Once one is chosen, it will need to be finalized and approved by Buckingham Palace.

President and CEO of the Royal Canadian Mint, Marie Lemay

"We expect to be able to share the selected design in the fall, so I think that will be a big moment," Lemay said, but added that it would still be several weeks before new coins enter circulation.

Charles's likeness on Canada's coins will also be facing left, as opposed the ones bearing his mother's image, who faces right.

The process of creating a new \$20 bill is expected to take a few years. Current Canadian money bearing the likeness of Elizabeth II will remain legal tender.

What will the effigy look like?

In keeping with long-standing tradition, His Majesty King Charles III's profile will face left. This is the opposite direction in which the portrait of Queen Elizabeth II was depicted. The initials of the winning artist will also appear on the obverse.

Why didn't we use the British effigy since it is already finished and approved?

Canadian coins have featured a royal effigy designed by Canadian artists since 1990 (Dora de Pédery-Hunt from 1990-2002 and Susanna Blunt from 2003 to the present). It is important that we continue to showcase the talent of Canadian artists on coins that will circulate by the millions across Canada for many years.
